While the print competitions will have to wait for better times, the SLF has been able to complete its three PDI competitions as these could be judged remotely. The inter-club final was won by South London PS in a closely fought match, prevailing over Beckenham PS by just half a point.

The other competitions were for the best certificated image in the PDI rounds and open PDI, which feature the best work created by members of the SLF clubs. Iggy Tavares did well in both, receiving an honourable mention in each. His images were "Tulips Fading into Art" and "Holly Berries" respectively. Congratulations, Iggy.

We had originally planned to finish our season on 15 July but I am pleased to announce a special online event for 29 July. Through his contacts on the island, Emmanuel Muscat has introduced our club to the Malta Institute of Professional Photographers. Despite its name, the organisation's membership also includes hobbyist photographers. We have agreed to hold a friendly contest with them to be called the "Friendship Image Challenge".

The details are being finalised but every member will shortly be invited to submit work via PhotoEntry to be considered for inclusion in our club's panel. Each club will have 24 images, with a maximum of two per author. There will be two judges, one from the UK and the other from Malta. This is a great opportunity to view photography from another part of the world and see how it is assessed by the judges from the two countries. And, of course, make new friends.
